MONTHLY REPORTS:

CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER:

Jenny Wilkinson explained that their numbers are low as they typically drop in the summer. 305 individuals received Advocacy services in the last quarter.

CIRCUIT CLERK:

Patrick McRae stated that they found a vendor to meet their needs on the signage project and it is finally moving forward. They had a Zoom meeting today with the Administrative Office of Illinois Courts to discuss a new fee that is being imposed on the county. For every Civil fee filing there will be a \$5.00 fee added which will go into a guardian fund.

CIRCUIT COURT:

Chief Judge Threlkeld explained that the upgrades to the technology at the Criminal Justice Center, courtroom 347 will begin later this month. The completed project will include an upgraded electronic system, visual display, audio and other features that will enhance the court experience. With grant money, the room off of courtroom 247 will become a foreclosure mediation room.

DETENTION HOME:

Jeff Seaman gave the following numbers for the month of July:

PROBATION:

Brad Paschal gave the following numbers for the month of July:

Individuals currently on probation: 3,373 (3,183 adults and 190 juveniles)
Pretrial services completed 1,782 criminal histories
Supervising 132 individuals on pre-trial release
Individuals in problem solving court: 104
Individuals in drug court: 65
Individuals in veterans' court: 22
Individuals in mental health court: 72
Individuals on electronic monitoring: 13 (8 county paid and 5 offender paid)
Public service unit is managing 29,945 hours of court ordered community service working with 392 adults and 26 juveniles

PUBLIC DEFENDER:

Mary Copeland explained that there have been more cases appointed to their office since the enactment of the Safe-T-Act than there were prior to it. In March-May 2025, 471 cases were appointed to their office and March-May 2026, 567 cases were appointed.

SHERIFF/JAIL POPULATION:

Chief Deputy Pulido gave the following numbers for the month of July:

Jail population as of today: 252

Detainees processed year to date: 2,638 which is an increase of 64 from last year

July average population: 272

10 detainees have been remanded to the custody of DHS at our facility and 3 at other facilities

January-July 2026 they received 13,591 calls for service

13,541 calls to 911 have been answered

Operators have taken 44,426 total calls including landlines, 911, and non-emergency calls

1,189 orders of protection and civil papers have been served

1,501 patrol requests were taken

60 firearms have been recovered

Just under 6 lbs. of cocaine, just over 3 lbs. of meth and just under ½ lb. of fentanyl have been recovered

STATE'S ATTORNEY:

Ali Foley stated that in July 261 felony cases have been issued. They received 289 referrals and 261 were charged. 48 petitions to detain have been filed. Of those they argued 37 hearings, 27 were detained and 10 were released which is a 73% held rate.

Mr. Holliday moved, seconded by Mr. Guy, to adjourn the meeting at 3:55 PM. *MOTION CARRIED.*
