Mr. Walden: Ladies and gentlemen, tonight I have the honor of recognizing Ms. Leslee Gibson and celebrating an incredible milestone, 35 years of dedicated service to Madison County. Ms. Gibson has been an integral part of our highway department, starting as a confidential secretary in 1990 advancing to accountant in 1999 and finally as an office manager these last few years. Through four county engineers, Ms. Gibson has played a pivotal role in keeping our operations running smoothly and efficiently. During my own transition, I relied heavily on her budget and expenditure expertise, her calm response and can-do attitude to any problem kept me grounded. Her attention to detail, financial acumen, and professionalism have ensured that our department's paperwork is always organized and within policy. Her commitment to excellence has been evident in every task, from managing ledgers to supporting our entire team with experience and dependability. As we recognize this remarkable achievement, we extend our heartfelt gratitude to Ms. Gibson for her dedication and invaluable contributions. Her hard work and loyalty have significantly impacted our department and our ability to serve our community. Leslee, enjoy your retirement and thank you for 35 years of exemplary service. We are truly grateful for the work that you did, and I know I'm not the only one when I say we are going to miss you.

Chairman Slusser: We're going to do those from now on when someone retires with many years of service like that, to honor them and wish them well in their retirement.

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Pastor Steve Jackson was presented the Living Legends Award by Member Holliday.

Mr. Holliday: Pastor and teacher Steve Jackson has served as the under ship of the Mt. Joy Church in Edwardsville for over 45 years, where he has built a diverse congregation. His focus is youth development, elder care, and winning lost souls to Christ. In addition to serving as pastor of Mt. Joy, Pastor Jackson has served as an administrator in the Edwardsville School District at the secondary level from 1997 to 2012 where he helped hundreds of at-risk kids learn to value themselves and to take advantage of their opportunities to succeed in education and life. His things were respect and accountability. That respect was demonstrated to the students first by him and the teaching staff. This helped the students to build and understand their value. They also learn to respect others, as well as believe in hope for their future. Pastor Jackson is a US Army veteran. His career in education was preceded by a career in investment banking at the US Bank in St Louis for 23 years, where he traded and sold stocks, bonds, and other financial instruments. His education includes a BS in economics and psychology from Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, MS in money markets and banking from Rutgers University New Jersey, and a MS in educational leadership from Southern Illinois University Edwardsville. Pastor Jackson is married to Linda Crawl Jackson, and he is the father of two daughters: Dr. Kimberly Nicole and Zipporah, two sons: Antwon and Alexander, as well as six grandsons: Joshua, Isaac, Jacob, Kysen, Cannon, Royce, and a granddaughter Khloe. He's proud of his family and takes every opportunity to encourage and bless them. His compassion, predictability, demeanor, and giving spirit are considered his trademark and can be counted on in all situations. One of his favorite scriptures is Philippians 4:8 that teaches us what brings things about are true, lovely, honest, pure, fair and of good rapport. I introduce Pastor Steve Jackson.

Pastor Jackson: Thank you, Michael. Thank you to the county board. I appreciate the recognition. I thank God for the opportunity to be of service to people and especially to children. I have no regrets. I look forward to being able to bless people more. God bless.

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RUSTY WHEAT'S ADDRESS TO THE BOARD:

Don't get excited with this blue sweatshirt. There's enough trash for both sides of the party. I'm a Republican, but I'll wear blue tonight. I wanted to tell you a story, and I like telling you all stories. Not too long ago, I was driving down the road, and there was a tremendous amount of trash alongside the road, and this was my area where I grew up, and so I reached out to the township highway commissioner and asked him about getting it picked up. His first response was that's not my jurisdiction. I said, okay, well, can you tell me who it is, and I'll call them. It was East Alton's jurisdiction, so I called East Alton, and immediately the street director says, hey, I don't want to get in the middle of you two guys. I said, what are you talking about? He goes I was told you were a troublemaker. The highway commissioner told him I was a troublemaker because I was insisting that they be responsible for their trash. The guy from East Alton didn't want to really do anything with me so I had to go out and prove to myself. I went out on Lewis and Clark Boulevard and picked up 15 bags of trash out there, and then it dawned on him that I was really not into it for any political reasons. This is the type of stuff I deal with all the time. Somebody forms an opinion, and then they tell somebody else, and then pretty soon I'm a troublemaker, and I am a troublemaker. If you're allowing trash to be on our streets, you're going to have trouble with me. We have got to have a different mindset. People that work for the public, public workers, are responsible for the public so it's not just a public job. It's a public responsibility. If you see trash lying along the road and you drive by it every day and you do nothing about it, you're just as guilty as the person that threw that out there. Give the county a call, give the city a call, give me a call. I met with every mayor in the area telling them that I'm offering my services. I do about 20 hours of community service work a week. I'm dead serious about this. I need your help. You need to go back and tell your people that if they drive by and see trash, they need to report it. Don't drive by it anymore. How many people who work here come down this road, 143, and see all this stuff? I don't know how they live with themselves. I know that I'm very optimistic, I know things are going to be changing for the better, and I just need your help. We've got to talk to the public workers and hold them accountable. It's not just a public job; it's a public responsibility.

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SEAN PLUTA'S ADDRESS TO THE BOARD:

Members of the county board, thank you for the opportunity to speak this evening. My name is Sean Pluta, and I'm an attorney representing Armoracia Solar, which has a pending special use application before the board this evening. I emailed you all a letter through the county clerk, and I hope you had time to consider the points I addressed in the letter. I brought and handed out paper copies. If anybody was missed, I have more, so if you haven't had an opportunity to read it, I'm happy to pass one out. The key message I want to get across from the letter is that the application we have submitted complies with section 93.106 of the zoning code, which contains the county standards applicable to solar farms. That section was revised to comply with the state law after the state of Illinois passed a siting statute that formalized standards that could be imposed on solar farms under county zoning law. Notably, the state law contains an express requirement that a county must approve a special use permit if the project is compliant with standards adopted in compliance with the state siting statute and other applicable law. Your review is clear here. Does the evidence before you indicate that the project and the application satisfy the requirements under Section 93.106 and other applicable law? The Zoning Board of Appeals conducted an evidentiary hearing to collect evidence on our matter, which is made up of our application exhibits, testimony, and the testimony of other people providing public comment. The Zoning Board of Appeals heard no evidence that indicated that our application did not comply with Section 93.106 or other applicable law. I ask you to search the evidentiary record and our application and determine whether we met the ordinance standard. If we have, I ask that you vote to grant Armoracia Solar a special use permit. It is not exactly clear why the ZBA voted to deny or to recommend denial of our project. I can opine based on opponent statements and questions and concerns that we have heard posed by the zoning board and the building and zoning committee, that there are property

value concerns and other health concerns. It's reasonable for you to consider how a solar farm would impact your community, but important that you weigh your concerns against the evidence that was presented and against the criteria provided in your ordinance and under the state law. We've provided ample expert testimony and evidence on property value and health concerns, both in our application and in testimony and in follow-up letters that we've provided to the building and zoning committee and today, to you, the county board. No opponents have provided contradictory expert testimony evidence, and since the ZBA, no other evidence has been presented under the record. Thank you for your time, and I request that you approve our project.

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JAKE CLAY'S ADDRESS TO THE BOARD:

Members of the county board, thank you for the opportunity to come and speak to you. My name is Jake Clay. I think I've made several phone calls to each of you. I apologize for all the messages, hopefully it didn't come across as pestering. I wanted to reach out and introduce the project. You heard from Sean, our attorney, about some of the legal side of it. I want to express what we've done for the project. Originally, we proposed two projects. We heard feedback from the community and from the neighbors. We shrunk the footprint down by about 40% so we went from a combined eight megawatts to five megawatts, and our footprint went from 26 acres inside the fence to about 15. In addition to that, we also proposed screening along the southern end of the project to provide a vegetative buffer between the project and the neighbors directly to the south. By shrinking the footprint, it allows us to avoid any tree clearing, including keeping a grove of trees on the north end that we heard from several neighbors was important for noise abatement from the highway and wildlife habitat and seeing coyotes and deer and hawks and bats and all that. We've been reaching out to the community since. I think my original letter went out in September. I've talked to almost every neighbor that adjoins the project. I've tried to address any concerns that they have with evidence that was in our application. Additionally, the benefits to the community here are an increase in property taxes that will be paid for by the project so no citizen or resident in Madison County has to pay additional taxes. The project will be responsible for an estimated 27 and a half thousand dollars of additional tax revenue in year one over the 600 that the tax rate currently is. In addition, any Ameren customer will be able to subscribe to the project and receive a discount on their energy bill in the form of bill credits. You may also be wondering why we chose this spot, like, why this piece of land? One, we're allowed. We're allowed to by the code to receive a special use permit, which we've done. That's why we're here. We have a willing landowner. We entered into a lease with the landowner, who you'll hear from soon. And then also interconnection capacity. That's the biggest constraint that we have. There is available capacity right on the Ameren distribution grid, right along Pleasant Ridge Road so we are going to interconnect there, and the power is going to stay local. We got one additional thing we did for the project. We moved the western edge of the project 650 feet to the east, so that as you drive down Pleasant Ridge Road, you'll see it for a split second through the driveway, and you won't have to see it after that. With that, I hope that you will vote to grant a special use permit for Armoracia Solar. Thank you for your time.

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BRAD SKERTICH'S ADDRESS TO THE BOARD:

My name is Brad Skertich. I'm Superintendent of the Collinsville School District, and before I make a short statement, I want to thank the county board members for their service to their respective communities as well as our county as a whole. I'm here to speak in opposition to the solar field on behalf of our school district in an unincorporated area of Maryville. Our district has been battling enrollment struggles for the last few years, working diligently with our city leaders in Collinsville, Maryville, Caseyville, and Fairmont City to expand not only residential but economic growth and we have made some steps in the right direction.

A solar field, as proposed, eliminates ground right for residential growth for 40 years, and while I understand there would be an increase in property taxes, there's no greater asset to our county than our students and more people living in Madison County. Furthermore, this would be detrimental to our district, especially with the renewed interest in residential development in our communities of Collinsville and Maryville. The past 18 months, we've been working extremely hard with the task force to grow that and like the opportunity to do that moving forward. I asked the county board on behalf of Unit 10 to not change the zoning and leave the plot as R1 as proposed before you tonight. Thank you.

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RACHEL TOLLETT'S ADDRESS TO THE BOARD:

Mr. Chairman and respected members of the county board, the last time I rose before you, it was because I told you I planned to buy a house and I was happy to pay more property taxes because I believed in good roads and good schools and well maintained fire districts and being able to buy an ambulance without an extra tax adjustment on a ballot. And I bought that house, and I've paid those property taxes, and this is now my fourth year in Madison County and my 17th year in the state of Illinois. I'm a transplant and I came from the Ozark Mountains of Arkansas, and I rise before you today because I was gravely disappointed on January 30th of this year to read a press release from Mr. Slusser as the Chairman of the Board that claimed that the only confusion over a funding freeze at the federal level was due to "the national media" and "congressional Democrats". The press release went on to state that Madison County did not participate in DEI or the Green New Deal, and that it would be "business as usual for various other programs that assist low-income residents". This press release disappointed me greatly for many reasons, not the least of which was the partisan assignment of blame for the fear and the worry caused by an executive order so general in its scope and lacking in detail that it caused multiple agencies and even conservative Republican Senator Chuck Grassley of Iowa to question the scope of the order. As a former teacher, it made me want to send it back and write clarity at the top with a question mark. Since that hastily clarified and poorly executed executive order, the citizens of this county have experienced effects because its dedicated researchers and teachers have faced frozen funding that was never reversed, even though this funding was previously approved by Congress. \$500,000 to the STEM Center at SIUE has been frozen. That grant affected two chemists, two biologists, and one psychologist, not because they used that grant for their salaries. They didn't use a dime to pay themselves. They used it to provide extensive opportunities for the children and the young people that attend summer STEM programs at SIUE get connected with internships and help them find better jobs when they graduate so that they can serve their communities. A grant through the EPA and the USDA that was supposed to help a biologist pay farmers across southern Illinois for unused farmland that couldn't grow crops so that they could have better wetlands and hopefully better farmland in the future has also been frozen. Just because these don't seem like obvious things doesn't mean that it hasn't affected our communities. I had great hope when you were elected, sir, that you would be a commonsense nonpartisan chair, and I am deeply disappointed to read that press release when we continue to face frozen funding that affects the children and the young people of Madison County.

JACOB FREY’S ADDRESS TO THE BOARD:

Good evening, I'm Jacob Frey. I am the owner of this property that the solar farm is going to go on. We have never been approached by anybody for residential development. This is the farthest field in Madison County from our farming operation. We have been approached by Cultivate Power to put the solar on it, and we think it's a good idea. We've made accommodations and made the project smaller to keep the trees and made a buffer. There's not going to be any reflection from the solar panels onto the interstate with the trees and the angle of them. It's an irregular shaped field that is not ideal for farming or houses. It's also a low production field so this is also why we think it will be nice to put in solar and it's going to provide a lot of revenue for the county also, compared to farming especially. That's all I have. Thank you.

TONY BODNAR’S ADDRESS TO THE BOARD:

My name is Tony Bodner. I am here to support the solar project. I've been living for the last 28 years this past December adjacent to the project. I've been through the original trustees that were with Edwardsville Bank that had said that that property was always zoned rural Ag, and then all of a sudden, somebody changed it to R3 recently. It hadn't been that way. This notion of we're going to put houses back there, if anybody's been back there, there's two big culvert ditches back there where it's probably from mine subsidence, where it's falling down. It's not the place where you're going to put houses. I can tell you that from being there, the 30 acres that are just to the east have been for sale for 28 years and still haven't sold yet. The notion to say, hey, this is going to be sold for houses is bull. I don't want them behind my house. I bought this house because of having the field there. I'm all for having the solar there. We have to do something. Madison County is expanding. Collinsville wants to expand, but what are we going to do about power? There are power outages often over there. The grid is right there down the way on 55. You have access there. This should be a no brainer that most of the people that are on that block are for this. I don't understand why others are going to interject the gentleman that owns the property, if he wants it there. For people to say that this is worthless, it isn't worthless. Wildlife is there. They're still going to be there. Someone at one of these meetings said he counted 60 deer there. There's never been in 28 years, 60 deer going through that property. There's been about 20 coyotes running through there, but never 60 deer. In fact, that person that made that comment has all his junk piled up on Pleasant Ridge, and he was worried about the way things were going to look but yet he doesn't worry about his own property. Also, there's kids that are running through that field on four wheelers, and cars. I've called the sheriff's department I can't tell you how many times, especially at two o'clock in the morning when two vehicles were stuck out there just two years ago. It's an open field, they can run through it. Everybody thinks if it's open, they can go ahead and use it. Nobody cares. Well, I do, I live there. My dogs are getting chased back and forth in my yard because these idiots are out on their four wheelers. I'm tired of it, so I don't think the plot substantiates any housing back there. The neighbors don't want any more housing. We bought there for a reason. If Collinsville needs more housing, there's many other places in Collinsville for that, but it isn't needed there. Thank you.

(A) ~~Agritourism operations~~ **Agricultural Experiences** include, but are not limited to, the following list of activities. On the question:

Mr. Madison: This was denied under the Zoning Board of Appeals, and then the denial was upheld under the zoning committee by one vote. A yes vote would be to uphold the denial of the solar issue, a no vote would be to allow it to pass.

Mr. Holliday: What was the reason for denial?

Mr. Madison: There were various reasons: property values were an issue, reflection on the highway and maybe onto the homeowners’ properties was an issue. They do use anti reflective tape or film on top of those, so they said that would not be an issue. There were electrical field issues; there was one neighbor that said they were sensitive to electrical fields. We don’t have evidence of what those might do. Then there were property values—hurting property values is one of the things that we looked at the most. Is this going to be detrimental to someone’s property values? I personally felt that it would be. There’s an argument that says it does not. There are arguments that say it improves property value. I’ve also read arguments that say it does go down. My big one, personally, was that the rule says 150 feet. They put the closest panel to the property line at 157 feet, so

more than was asked by the state. I, personally, feel that's way too close. My driveway is about 130 feet long; it's not very long. 150 feet is not very far to have a whole field of solar panels behind you. To me, personally, I feel it's too much to impose on homeowners that are already there. If you build a solar farm and people want to build up to it, that's completely their choice. But to me, this takes away those homeowners' choice. I feel that the state is imposing that rule of 150 feet on them. I don't think that's right. I think that this ought to personally be moved out further away from residences. That's the main reason that I voted no.

Ms. Lamothe: I have not been on the board that long, as you know, I've never been on the Building and Zoning Committee, and I've never seen a proposal this detailed; it was like a dissertation. I noticed that the reactions were mixed. The Zoning Board of Appeals voted to deny it by three to one, and then the Building and Zoning Committee voted to uphold that denial four to two. I read the letters, although Mr. Dickerson characterized the opposition as pretty much total. The letters that I was able to read in the packet had two neighbors in favor, actually quite strongly, two opposed, and the landowner is in favor. Not that long ago, we voted to allow the building of a truck stop off the highway, even though all of the neighbors nearby were opposed to that and organized to oppose it, as they had done other developments before. The property owner was in favor of that development. We voted in favor of the development. The other argument that swayed people was that that development was going to produce revenue for the community. This development will produce more revenue for the community. I am going to vote yes, well no, actually no, because that's yes, I'm going to vote no, but it's not because I'm afraid of litigation. I felt that when I read the original proposal, the adjustments that they made after going to the hearing and hearing people's concerns, I believe they've addressed those issues, and I have driven by solar farms on I-90 more than I want to count. They are by highways in other parts of our country. I go by one regularly in Indiana when we drive back to New England. I see them on Cape Cod, an area of the country that has less sunlight than we do. It's cloudier there more often. Anyway, that's my reason behind my vote.

Mr. Madison: To be fair, the truck stop or gas station that we voted for was existing commercial property that had previously been a gas station, and that subdivision built up next to it knowing that it was commercial property, so there is a fair bit of difference there. This property is zoned Residential Three.

Mr. Nicolussi: This is my district. I live about a half a mile from this place. I jog by it, weather permitting. I want to piggyback off what Ms. Lamothe said about community sentiment. Sure, there are some people for it. I've definitely heard from them, and they were very polite. I had good conversations with them. I'll say the overwhelming majority of my community is against it, that I've talked to. I've never seen an issue they're so strong on. As for as the city leadership, once again, it's unanimous. They're against this. I have a letter from the city stating how they would not like it. They have a commercial-residential task force set up. It's a long letter. Anybody that wants to see it, I have copies, or can provide them for you. I will be voting no.

Mr. Holliday: For the reflection, if they turned it around the other way, would it not be a problem?

Mr. Madison: If they turned it the other way, because they're angled to hit the sun at the correct angle, or the best angle that they can to get electricity produced, then they wouldn't be pointing towards the sun. One way it would be pointing towards the homes, the other way it would be pointing towards the highway. I'm not sure that there's a perfect answer there. I didn't use that reason to vote, myself, because I'm not sure it is an issue, but some members thought it was

Mr. Dickerson: I will be voting no, and I have personal experience with this from my neighborhood.

Mr. Haine: You'll be voting no to allow it?

Mr. Dickerson: Pardon me, I'll be voting yes to approve the denial. Thank you for that. The reason why I'll be voting yes to approve the denial is because in my community, some of you may or may not be aware, but

nobody actually came and complained at the time, we actually voted to approve it. It still hasn't been done. There are too many questions within this lovely state we live in, and those issues remain. For example, the state has a two-year rule, if you will, for the permit, but the state refuses to uphold that two-year rule, which says it expired in my community. It's expired by the state of Illinois, but state of Illinois has decided not to adhere to that two-year rule, and I feel like the state is very deliberate in ignoring their own rules. I think it's a shame that we're doing this to residents. In this case, the residents, clearly the majority of them are against it. I agree that some are for it, but I believe the majority is against it, and I choose to support the people. I'm voting yes to accept it.

Mr. Madison: Also, I'd like to add, generally, when we vote on these, it goes into a lottery, so to speak, and they may or may not be picked. We may go through all this, and they may never get picked to be built, but it may, and you might look at Chris Doucleff to see if this is one of those or not, because I'm not sure.

Mr. Doucleff: This is a part of the Illinois Shines Program. I think they possibly may not get the funding, but probably there's a good likelihood they would.

Chairman Slusser: Now remember, you're voting basically the opposite of normal in this. If you vote yes, you're upholding the decision to deny. A no vote would approve the project.

Mr. Dickerson moved, seconded by Mr. Kincheloe to approve the item as presented.

Ms. Lamothe: I noticed that Brewer was described as the lowest responsible bidder. I just noticed some price changes on a lot of things in the agenda. I noticed that the Brewer Machine and Gear bid was originally \$120,448.54 and then it increased to \$172,756 and there was a much lower bid. I just wondered, what does it mean? The lowest responsible bidder? What does that mean? I don't know.

Mr. Nottrott: At the time of the original bid, we entertained bids based on performance specs, and based on those performance specs, we looked at the products that were being offered, the gearbox for the screw stations that have been there for 40-some-odd years, 43 years. This one was more in line with what we had before, provided maintenance over the past number of years, plus Brewer supplied that maintenance and the parts for that design. That's why we selected it. Once we got into the replacement six months later, once the material finally got there, we found a great deal of concealed damage in the drive shaft, in the bearings within two of the screw stations. That's the additional \$52,000. At the time when the damage was found, we didn't have time to put it back out for bid, another six weeks or so, we're moving 2-3-4-million gallons of raw sewage through that one point. We couldn't afford to be down to just one pump.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Slusser: I'll start. There's one thing that Liz is going to kill me for if I don't remind everyone. The county board pictures will be on April 16th, so we'll have to arrive early. Check your emails on that. I know we've had cancelations due to weather and some other committee changes, so we're going to try to get this done on April 16th so make sure you're here that day for the picture.

Mr. Madison: Just a couple quick things. First of all, I would say I did not disagree with your press release. I appreciated it, just for the record. One of the things I wanted to bring up, for a couple weeks I've been seeing some signs in people's offices around the building that say Fair Contract. I believe that is not appropriate. The main reason I feel it is not appropriate, first of all, I believe we have a negotiation agreement that states that people won't discuss this process in public. Well, it kind of does that. It kind of builds an us-against-them mentality and I don't like that. I think that makes for a negative workplace and poor morale. It is not an us-against-them situation, and I believe we always end up agreeing to a fair contract. Ever since I've been here for 12 years we have done that, so I'd like to see those go away. I think the citizens of the county would appreciate that and prefer that, honestly. Thank you.

Ms. Ogden: Back when I worked in Purchasing, we purchased a cabinet with glass doors right outside the county clerk's office, right before you get to the veteran's office that was just for the Union to put all of their meeting information and their stuff. I don't know if it's still there. Do you know?

Ms. Andreas: It's still there.

Mr. Eaker: I noticed those signs that Mr. Madison was talking about, and I was going to mention it if he didn't, but I totally agree with him.

* * * *

Mr. Holliday: Many people believe a historical narrative of the “free state” of Illinois as a safe haven for Black people in the United States. However, slavery began in what would later become Illinois in 1720. The Northwest Ordinance of 1787 prohibited slavery in the Northwest Territory, but legislation in 1813 prevented free Black people from immigrating to the Illinois Territory. In March 1819, the First Illinois General Assembly enacted a system of “Black Laws” limiting the rights of free people of color. Nonetheless, free African Americans helped build the early history of Madison County. The patriarch of the Singleton family in Collinsville settled in the county before 1815. Robert Crawford came to Pin Oak County in 1819. By 1850, James Henry Johnson and Samuel Bates achieved prosperity as homeowners in Foster Township. Many African Americans who fought in the segregated Union Army also made their homes in Madison County. Seventy-four Black men living in Madison County when war broke out enlisted with Company E of the 29th Regiment, United States Colored Infantry. Other Black veterans settled in Madison County after the war.

Collinsville Township records of 1850 include a register of free people of color. The list has twenty names. Among them are James Suggs Singleton, his wife Phillis, and their three sons: James, Isaac, and John. The register says that Phillis and the children obtained their freedom from a man named Ogle in St. Clair County. Phillis traveled to the Illinois Territory with Colonel Joseph Ogle, a white Revolutionary War veteran. Ogle left New England for Illinois in 1785. He had settled in St. Clair County in 1789. Census records for 1830 and 1840 enumerate a James Singleton household of “free colored persons” in northern St. Clair County, near Madison County. Sources suggest he is the eldest son of James Suggs Singleton and Phillis Singleton. In 1850, James and his wife Elizabeth still lived in St. Clair County. James and his sons Isaac, James, and Oliver worked as laborers.

James Henry Johnson was born in 1810 to an enslaved mother in Virginia. After gaining his freedom, he lived first in Kentucky and then in Missouri, working in the lead mines. He and his wife Eleanor moved from Missouri to the Wood Station area in Foster Township. They started Oak Leaf Farm in 1850 with eighty acres. By the time of his death in 1863, Johnson owned 200 acres of contiguous land. Johnson founded and pastored Baptist churches in the Alton area. He also represented Madison County at the State Convention of Colored Citizens of the State of Illinois in 1856. Oak Leaf Farm, still owned by the Johnson family today after over 150 years, qualifies as one of seven “sesquicentennial farms” in Madison County.

That's just some black history I wanted to bring up.

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Chairman Slusser: I do want to address quickly the press release that was in question that we sent last month. I handed out copies of the actual memo, the OMB memo that raised so much concern, as well as the Q&A that was put out the next day by the White House. If you look at page two of the memo, it does say federal agencies must temporarily pause all activities related to obligation or disbursement of all federal financial assistance and other relevant agency activities that may be implicated by the executive orders. That's the key part, may be implicated by the executive orders. Including, but not limited to financial assistance for foreign aid, non-governmental organizations, DEI, woke gender ideology in the Green New Deal. When I saw that memo, I looked, and we were not spending money from any of our grant funding here in Madison County through our Community Development Department on any of these items; none of the money that we receive that goes to direct assistance to any citizens of Madison County would be implicated by the executive order. We had nothing to worry about. Our money was going to continue. Then I started seeing press conferences that were more scare tactics than anything. I thought they should have been ashamed of themselves, some of the things they were saying, including one of our congresswomen, and claiming that rental assistance was being frozen, LIHEAP, which is low-income energy assistance, and all sorts of things were being cut off, even that HUD funds were being suspended, which was also not true. I contacted her office because that's the way I do business, those of you who know me know I'm very principled in my position but I'm not a bomb thrower. I called the congresswoman's office, spoke to her district director, who I have a very good relationship with, and I have a very good relationship with this congresswoman, even though we're different political parties, and I voiced my displeasure with the press conference. He said, well, there's just so much confusion. I said there's not confusion if you read what was said in the memo. Then the memorandum, which then followed up to say, is this a freeze on all financial federal financial assistance? No, and it goes into an explanation. That's a few pages in there, and it explains everything that was all out in the public before these press conferences started happening, which was very disappointing to me. I said I'm not happy with this misinformation going out there because we have vulnerable residents in our county who are struggling in the middle of winter and they're freaking out right now, and I don't want them freaking out because they have nothing to worry about in regard to these programs. I let them know that I'd be issuing a statement contradicting much of what they were saying. He appreciated the call, he understood, and the heads up and the courtesy. That's when we sent the press release out. The only reason I was somewhat partisan in my comment is because it came from one particular political party that was saying that, and that's why I wanted to point that out. Ms. Lamothe had concerns. She came and met with me, a couple of different people met with me, and we discussed these. I'll tell you, the board members, just so you have a heads up, we'll make sure you have a copy before it goes to the press, so you're always informed. That was my process on that. I'm not an overtly partisan bomb thrower, but in that particular case, because I realize I represent everybody in this county, whether they voted for me or not, whether they're Republican or Democrat or someone who doesn't vote, period. I represent everyone. I also take great care in representing the most vulnerable people in this county, and those are the people near and dear to my heart. I'm not going to create panic and fear in those people. The whole point of this was to ease the tension and the frustration and the fear of these people. That's why I did it.

Mr. Holliday: The one thing though when it came out, it seemed to create a division, and in my opinion, we get along good here in Madison County. I don't think we need to bring that harsh partisanship around. Let us take care of our people and do what we need to do here, and not let that rhetoric up there in Washington, DC filter down on us because we're doing good in this county.

Chairman Slusser: That's why I didn't address any local Democrats here, because we do get along. I feel like we all have a good relationship. We work well. It was just at the congressional level, that's who I was addressing.

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Mr. Madison: I just wanted to clarify one thing. I would like to see all those fair contract signs come down because I personally believe that we want to be as unified as possible at the county. That's management, employees, county board members, elected officials, and I think that's what our citizens would prefer.

Chairman Slusser: We'll review our policy and see what's allowed and not allowed.

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Mr. Ross moved, seconded by Mr. Dickerson at 6:51 PM to recess this session of the Madison County Board meeting until March 19, 2025. *MOTION CARRIED.*
