MONTHLY REPORTS:

CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER:

Jenny Wilkinson stated that they had 144 children come through the center between August and October 2025: She mentioned that number is about the size of 4-5 classrooms of kids. She thanked the board for their support and said they could not have serviced those kids without their support.

DETENTION HOME:

Aleena Wessel reported the following numbers for the month of October:

Juveniles in custody on first day of month: 19

Juveniles released during month: 23

Juveniles admitted during month: 21

There was a total of 40 minors that went through the program for the month. Their mental health professional did 48 counseling sessions; 17 suicide screens and 2 minors were downgraded from high risk to low risk. As of today, there are no minors on the high-risk suicide watch. The counseling sessions are having a huge impact. They have a new program that will be going through the detention center in addition

to the regular school programs they have. Lewis & Clark will be doing a GED prep class with some of their minors to help them get their GED upon exiting the detention home. She thanked the committee for their support.

PROBATION:

Kevin McKee reported the following numbers for the month:

Individuals on probation: 3,533

Pretrial Services completed 2,579 criminal histories/risk assessments

Individuals on Pretrial release 56

Individuals on electronic monitoring: 32. 28 adults and 4 juveniles. 17 are county paid and 15 are self-paid.

Veterans Court: 23

Problem Solving Court: 101

Mental Health Problem Solving Court 13

Drug Problem Solving Court:65

They had a graduation on the 28th and 28 individuals successfully completed the program. He stated that Ed Zabotka was recently recognized by IPCSA as officer of the year for the entire state of Illinois. He is a high-risk officer, and he has been with the department for 30 years.

PUBLIC DEFENDER: No report

SHERIFF/JAIL POPULATION:

Marcos Pulido reported the following numbers:

Detainees in custody as of this morning: 292

Number of detainees processed for current year: 3,857

Increase from last year: 592

Monthly average jail population to date: 266

They have 5 detainees in custody that are remanded to DHS. They have 3 at Kankakee County and 5 at their facility. Captain Jody Coleman will be retiring next week. They will be doing some promotions due to that retirement. He recognized the Child Advocacy Center for the work they do and stated they were recently accredited and recognized by the chapter as one of the best in the nation.

STATE'S ATTORNEY:

Tom Haine gave kudos to his team for completing many positive and strong resolutions. They want to put repeat violent offenders behind bars for as long as possible to stop them from victimizing the community. He stated that they have had more felony cases year to date than they had for the full year in 2024. He is proud of their team and the work they do.
